U.S. Foodservice's Monarch Food Group offers Rituals Estate coffee.

For food supplier, clients' health is key ingredient

For U.S. Foodservice Inc., surviving the recession doesn't mean scaling back. The distributor, which moved its headquarters to Rosemont last year, just added a million square feet of warehouse space and increased its salesforce by 5%.

Its challenge is making sure customers stay in business.

Half of its \$19.8 billion in revenue comes from independent restaurants, eateries with no more than three locations. Those businesses are struggling with high food costs and fewer diners: The National Restaurant Assn.'s index of restaurant activity hit a record low in December.

In response, U.S. Foodservice is emphasizing cheaper private-label products and providing resources to help its customers stay profitable. For example, the company produced a cookbook of entrees that restaurants could sell for less than \$10 each.

"We need to help customers survive this period, and then as the economy returns, we'll all be in good shape," CEO Robert Aiken says.

Meanwhile, the idea behind adding 200 sales reps and warehouse space in New York, Salt Lake City and Minneapolis is to gain marketshare. U.S. Foodservice currently accounts for about 10% of the food-service distribution market, trailing only Houston-based Sysco Corp.

"U.S. Foodservice has made some terrific progress in the last three years, and they are well-positioned to increase their marketshare in this very tough environment," says Gary Karp, executive vice-president of Technomic Inc., a food industry research firm in Chicago. "If you're going to be aggressive, that gives you the best opportunity to succeed."

U.S. Foodservice moved its headquarters to Rosemont from Columbia, Md., in 2008, a year after New York private-equity funds Clayton Dubilier & Rice Inc. and Kohlberg Kravis Roberts & Co. purchased the company from Royal Ahold N.V., the Dutch supermarket giant. Under Ahold, U.S. Foodservice grew rapidly through acquisitions of companies like Alliant Foodservice but also suffered an accounting fraud scandal that resulted in Ahold overstating U.S. Foodservice's revenue by \$880 million.

By summer, all 400 corporate employees will be based in Rosemont

As paper biz shrinks, Midland tries other lines

In 2003, Wheeling-based Midland Paper Co. reinvented itself as Midland Paper Packaging & Supplies. The name change signaled a strategic shift that began to pay off last year.

Amid losses elsewhere in the industry, Midland posted 2008 revenue growth of 3.6% to \$710 million.

For many suppliers, rising paper and transportation costs and a shift to electronic communication have taken a bite out of revenue. As a result, the Institute for Trend Research, an economic consulting firm based in Concord, N.H., forecasts another bleak year for much of the industry.

Stephen Atkinson, an industry analyst at Toronto-based BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc., agrees. "The demand is down in North America for paper," he says. "There's a shrinking market, and companies are just waiting for it to come around."

Though packaging and other industry segments also are suffering, diversification has helped Midland bridge the gap left by losses in the paper business, says CEO E. S. Hooker III. Over the past five years, Midland has branched out to packaging supplies and equipment, publication printing, facilities supplies and consulting. While paper remains the big revenue driver, industrial services and products now account for 10% of sales and 20% of profit.

Midland works with suppliers

Midland works with suppliers like Neenah Paper Inc., 3M Co., Smurfit-Stone Container Corp., Kimberly-Clark Corp. and Newell Rubbermaid Inc. to serve thousands of customers nationwide from its sales and distribution locations in seven states.

Founded in 1907, Midland has grown since Mr. Hooker and Executive Vice-president Frank Morley purchased it in 1983, when the company generated annual revenue of \$14 million. In the past 25 years, it has acquired four paper companies.

Midland did not make any acquisitions in 2008, "but that's a good thing," Mr. Hooker says. Instead, he credits large inventories, an established distribution footprint and dedicated employees for the company's revenue surge.

Mr. Hooker says there are no plans for big changes in 2009.

"We plan to stay the course in what we anticipate will be a very difficult year," he says.

Outside the box: Container maker is growing, hiring

Berlin Packaging LLC is doing something unusual these days: It's hiring.

As part of an initiative called "Operation Wolfpack," the Chicago packaging supplier increased its salesforce by 25% in just 30 days and is planning another round of hiring later this year.

The expansion is possible in part because its revenue grew 11.7% last year to \$383 million. The company supplies more than 24,000 types of bottles, jars, pumps and tubes to 8,000 customers, including Abbott Laboratories Inc., Alberto-Culver Co., J. M. Smucker Co. and Neutrogena Corp.

Also fueling its gains are hot categories like energy drinks, salsa, vitamins and household cleansers—and insulation from the troubled automotive and construction industries.

For the past decade, Berlin has offered customers financing, design, consulting and global services, often free. These services demonstrate a commitment to innovation and development of services that add value to suppliers and customers, says Adam Fein, president of Pembroke Consulting Inc., a Philadelphia-based management consulting and advisory firm

That, in turn, has helped Berlin weather the recession, CEO Andrew Berlin says. Prospective clients are taking advantage of free services, boosting the company's packaging business. For its part, Berlin boasts 50-plus months of more than 99% on-time delivery.

"People talk about customer satisfaction, but I think that sets the bar too low," Mr. Berlin says. "You have to set out to thrill a customer."

As audit clients turn away from Big Four, BDO rises

A raft of recent litigation doesn't appear to be deterring price-conscious audit clients from seeking the services of BDO Seidman LLP.

In fact, the Chicago-based accounting firm launched its first massmedia ad campaign in February, hoping to capitalize on its recent success in luring business away from the larger and more expensive Big Four accounting firms.

The ad campaign began just days after a former BDO partner pleaded guilty to tax evasion and conspiracy related to the marketing of tax-shelter products. That followed a December lawsuit that accuses BDO of BDO is private See Page 19

negligence in the Bernard Madoff scandal. Then there's the 2007 Florida verdict in which BDO was ordered to pay \$521 million in damages in another negligence case; an appeal is pending. BDO

CEO Jack Weisbaum declined interview requests.

Despite the legal snarls, BDO's business is growing. From 2005 to 2008, the firm's revenue grew 81% to \$659 million, fueled by an expanding consulting practice and traction with companies leaving the Big Four. Now the recession is causing

even more audit clients to shop around for firms like BDO and Chicago-based competitor Grant Thornton LLP.

"There are CFOs out there looking to cut costs who are saying a BDO audit is just as good as a Big Four audit, but without the sticker shock," says Allan Koltin, CEO and president of PDI Global Inc., a Chicago-based accounting industry consultancy. "This didn't used to happen until the last five or six years, and now in the last few months it's accelerating.'

Terlato uncorks marketing push despite recession

Terlato Wine Group had an up year in 2008, but this year is presenting challenges.

The Lake Bluff-based company's niche is high-end wines. It produces the Rutherford Hill and Tangley Oaks labels, among others, and imports brands such as Mazzoni and Chapoutier.

Sales for high-end wines are difficult to track, says Ann Gilpin, an industry analyst at Morningstar Inc. in Chicago, but there's little doubt that the industry as a whole has been hit hard in this recession as consumers trade down to less expensive vintages.

"Lately, it's become really price-competitive," Ms. Gilpin says.

While bigger names in the liquor business have scaled back, Terlato has expanded its marketing and salesforce, adding two new national sales positions in February.

"We think that provides us with a unique opportunity," says CEO William Terlato, 48. "Where they're creating a void, we want to step in and fill that void."

The company started in the 1950s when Anthony Terlato, now 73, opened a liquor store in Chicago.

Today, Terlato has a 12% share of the relatively small U.S. market for bottles priced at \$14 and up. The company had revenue of \$250 million in 2008, up 4.2% from 2007.

Talk about toxic assets: Cleanup biz sees gold in hazardous waste

The Tameling family has found plenty of green in toxic waste.

In the 1950s, Ben Tameling began hauling manure and later garbage. After the Environmental Protection Agency was established, he founded SET Environmental Inc., in 1978, to dispose of toxic waste. The environmental services company is now in its third generation.

Last year, SET responded to 1,252 emergencies and 3,387 scheduled calls for hazardous waste disposal, industrial cleaning and mercury decontamination, generating revenue of \$54 million, up 13.7% from the year before. The Wheeling-based company's local customers include Exelon Corp., Nicor Inc., Peoples Gas, Abbott Laboratories Inc. and Northwestern Uni-

If Chicago gets the 2016 Olympics, SET hopes to be part of the action. As the hazardous waste contractor for the city's Department of Environment, the company will vie for a contract to decontaminate the shuttered Michael Reese Hospital, the planned site for the Olympic Village.

Emergency response is the "sexy" side of business, according to Chad Tameling, vice-president of sales and Ben Tameling's grand-son. SET responds to three emergencies a day, on average, even fielding calls from the FBI. Past emergencies have included cleanup after floods, hurricanes and chemical spills, examining packages containing suspicious powders and using "CSI"-style forensics to determine which chemical a boy in Iraq had swallowed, ultimately saving his life.

SET also has carved out a niche in a growing market segment: compressed gas cylinders. The company operates a milk run of sorts to collect the cylinders, often from competitors, and recycle them for reuse. Larger companies tend to shy away from the business because of the risk of explosions and the attending liability, notes David Case, executive director of the Environmental Technology Council, a Washington, D.C.-based trade association for the hazardous waste industry.

Though SET deals with some dangerous substances, it takes more-calculated risks when it comes to expansion. Last year, it acquired a small environmental services company near Oklahoma City, and it's eying another acquisition this year, possibly in Milwaukee

or St. Louis. SET's goals reflect a broader industry trend, Mr. Case notes.

"The middle name of this industry is consolidation," he says.



Contractor may get boost from stimulus bucks

targeted by the stimulus plan. Its name has been on some of the largest Chicago-area construction projects in recent years, including the Chicago Transit Authority's Brown Line renovation and the reconstruction of Terminals 1 and 2 at O'Hare International Airport.

According to some analysts' forecasts, the frozen credit markets will thaw enough by 2010 to boost private investment in construction projects the following year. Until then, contractors such as Paschen, which have experience in the private sector but earn their bread and butter on public-works projects, are banking on a stimulus-backed boom.


"The stimulus pieces are the buoyant pieces of the construction market," says Kim Kennedy, manager of forecasting for McGraw-Hill Construction, a unit of publisher McGraw-Hill Cos., which tracks nation-wide construction trends.

Paschen, which also has offices in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and suburban Los Angeles, saw 2008 revenue rise 31.4% to \$574 million. CEO Frank Paschen declined requests for an interview.

Recession puts Portillo's on menu for more diners

The slowing economy is driving diners to more inexpensive places, benefiting family restaurants like Portillo's.

Portillo Restaurant Group saw its revenue increase 8.8% in 2008 to \$220 million.

"Similar to McDonald's, Portillo's is a limited-service concept with a high quality and a lower price point compared to full-service (restaurants), which puts them in a great position to provide value," says Darren Tristano, an executive vice-president at Chicago-based restaurant consultancy Technomic Inc.

Richard Portillo, 69, started the company in 1963 as a hot dog stand in Villa Park. Without franchising or investors, the company now has about 3,700 employees in 46 units, with four separate brands and a catering division. Some of those restaurants gross more than \$8 million annually, Mr. Portillo says.

The company is not heavily leveraged, Mr. Portillo says, and that's helped it keep prices from rising much. Since 2005, Portillo's—known for its Chicago-style hot dogs and Italian beef sandwiches—has opened two restaurants in California and one in Merrillville, Ind. But Mr. Portillo says he is watching the economy and will make conservative choices about whether to expand further.

"I'm not a publicly held company. I'm in no race with anybody," he says. "I will go at the speed in which I feel very comfortable."

Downturn pokes hole in pocket maker's pocket

When you reach into your pocket for loose change, you probably don't think about who made that pocket. But odds are pretty good it was one of Chicago's largest privately held companies: QST Industries Inc.

QST, which makes pocketing, waistbands and interlinings for such familiar clothing brands as Gap, Liz Claiborne and Levi's, was founded in 1880 to sell trimmings to Chicago's tailors and athome sewers. It remains familyowned and -operated five generations later.

For about a century, QST made its products in Chicago, before shifting production to North Carolina and then spreading it to more than 30 countries worldwide. The company has about 750 employees and an estimated marketshare of three-quarters of the pre-manufactured pocketing sold in the world, says Jeff Carlevato, the company's chief operating officer and chief financial officer.

But the recent economic turmoil has caused instability in the retail apparel business: QST's revenue dipped 7.9% in 2008 to \$152 million. Mr. Carlevato expects that number to drop in 2009 to about \$140 million.

Overall, retail sales at clothing and accessories stores were down 10.3% in the year to January, according to U.S. Department of Commerce figures.

QST appears to be "performing pretty well in a very discretionary marketplace," says Steven Platt, director and research fellow at the Hinsdale-based Platt Retail Institute, which provides research and consulting to retailers. But he warns that the near-term outlook for apparel is "very weak."

The company has been looking to streamline operations and create partnerships to keep overhead down, Mr. Carlevato says.

In early 2008, it laid off 26 people at its Mocksville, N.C., plant as health insurance costs forced the company to shift more production to Mexico and the Dominican Republic. Also that year, the company opened a waistband factory in Morocco; it plans to open a new facility this year in Vietnam.

"I've got to say that QST's balance sheet is probably as strong as it's ever been, despite the economic downturn," Mr. Carlevato says.

Can maker's new bag: recyclable plastic containers

For more than 80 years, Central Can Co. has produced steel pails, cans, covers, plugs, lids and handles in its Chicago plant. But with the price of steel going up, the manufacturer has had to learn some new tricks.

This summer, it will begin producing a new line of 100% recyclable, all-plastic containers—Cen-Tite that feature an easy-open and easy-pour design. The company began making plastic containers in 2005, and less than five years later, plastics account for 36% of total sales. It also plans to add a hybrid metal-plastic product to its lineup.

Central Can produces more than 600 types of containers for customers including Valspar Corp., Safety-Kleen Systems Inc. and Ace Hard-

Kline says. When steelmakers imposed surcharges on raw materials last year, Central Can had no choice but to pass along higher prices. The product line, launched in December, has generated tremendous interest, Mr. Kline says.

"It's really a reflection of what consumers want," he

Last year, Central Can posted revenue of \$86 million, up 16.2% from the year before. In 2007, revenue shrunk by 1%, Mr. Kline says. Key to the turnaround: steel cans for vegetable oil.

As a contractor on a U.S. Department of Agriculture world food aid program, Central Can produced more than 22 million 4liter vegetable oil cans last year for export to countries around the world.

Diversification is prudent given the slowdown in the construction industry and the company's sensitivity to shifts in steel prices, says Robert Budway, president of the Washington, D.C.-based trade group Can Manufacturers Institute. But that doesn't mean steel containers are a thing of the past.

"This economy is favoring the metal can, especially on the food side of the business," Mr. Budway

Assn. manager, clients ride out storm together

There aren't many industries thriving in the current economic climate, but SmithBucklin isn't a typical business.

An association management company, SmithBucklin oversees every aspect of its nonprofit clients' operations, from personnel to technology infrastructure.

Those clients are diverse, ranging from the American Academy of Cosmetic Surgery to the Popcorn Board—its first account, in 1949. According to CEO Henry Givray, associations tend to stay afloat even when the economy tanks, and that's one reason the Chicago-based company's revenue has remained strong.

The largest association management company in the world, SmithBucklin saw 2008 revenue rise 14.9% from a year earlier to \$102 million. The company is projecting growth of 3% to 5% in 2009.

Even so, Mr. Givray sees some potential speed bumps ahead.

"Our client organizations are facing challenges, and that translates to challenges for us," he says. "We're telling them they have to tighten their client budgets, since we manage them, which also impacts us."

For SmithBucklin, a potential upside of the recession is that tough times may prompt more non-profits to consider outsourcing functions—new business the company is pushing hard to capture, Mr. Givray says.

SmithBucklin isn't the only association manager looking to diversify in this way, says Andrea Bower, executive director of the AMC Institute, a trade group based in Philadelphia. Industry executives are asking "what other means are there to assist associations in raising dollars to offset a decline in dues—i.e., journals, educational seminars or webinars"

Drop in fliers gives parking biz air sickness

Off-site airport parking operator PRG Parking Management LLC has seen its business nearly grounded in the past seven months.

The Chicago-based company's remote lots offer an alternative to pricey airport parking, but PRG hasn't been immune to the struggling economy. The airport parking business lives and dies by the number of travelers heading in and out of the nation's airports.

"It's been a tough year," concedes CEO Martin Nesbitt, whose company does business as The Parking Spot LLC. "But it's a good opportunity to focus

on how to run your business better. We'll emerge, I think, with a higher-margin business when we come out of this downturn."

Mr. Nesbitt founded PRG in 1998, in partnership with Global Hyatt Corp.'s Penny Pritzker. PRG owns or manages 19 airport parking lots across the country. Revenue rose 7.8% in 2008 to \$91.3 million. For 2009, PRG predicts revenue will decline by 10.3%.

Even so, operators such as PRG, with many lots in many cities, are at an advantage, says Shawn Conrad, executive director of the International Parking Institute, a trade group based in Fredericksburg,

Va.

"These companies like PRG are highly sophisticated, really well-run," Mr. Conrad says. "They're able to weather storms better than some of these operators trying to do it on their own, with higher manhour costs."
